

Westmead Ace & Lyreen Mover shine in the Hungarian rain Two greyhounds familiar

Two greyhounds familiar to British racegoers made the headlines in the CGRC European Championships at Rabapatona in Hungary.

Runners from 10 different countries supported the twoday event in late September, braving some very wet and miserable weather.

Former Swindon Produce Stakes runner-up Westmead Ace, now trained by Gerhard Müller in Germany, won the big event.

The 39 kilo son of Toms The Best and Mega Delight covered the 492 metres in 30.28 for a one length win over the Czech trained Irish bred entry Foulksrath Lass (Widziolek).

The consolation final went to none other than the English Derby runner-up Lyreen Mover.

Max Picinelli's track record holder was the reigning champ but was surprising beaten in the semi finals by Ace (29.48).
